STROUD FIGHTS BACK AGAINST AUSTERITY

The average UK person earned £33 less each week in 2014 than in 2009, or £1750 less than 5 years ago. It's not only wages - terms, conditions and pensions are also being cut

Those who can't find or are unable to work have been faced with an cuts to benefits, and the threat of sanctions. More and more people rely on foodbanks - over 900,000 received 3 days emergency food in 2013/14.

In England, local government spending has fallen 29% between 2009 and 2015. Gloucestershire County Council has cut £120 million from its budget - with services like libraries and youth centres closing or being left to volunteers to run.




The NHS is experiencing it's worst funding squeeze in 50 years and thanks to the Health & Social Care Act 2012, the market in our NHS has expanded - services are forced into expensive auctions or 'tenders' with more and more privatisation taking place - our local non-emergency ambulances are now run by Arriva and the pharmacy service in our community hospitals will now be run by Lloyds.

The Royal Mail has been privatised, and the expansion of free-schools and academies are slowly privatising our education system.

Disabled people and women have been hit hard by policies like the bedroom tax and cuts to legal aid.
